We well received all your donated optics, 2 spotting scopes (Swarovski and Iralin Vergutong (30x75) with 2 tripods and small backpack and 4 pairs of binoculars (Leica 10x42, Zeiss B8 x 25, Celestron 12 x 50, and Zeiss) in good condition on 18 June, 2018.

It was the great help to my team and students in the field to observe not only Sand Martins but also other wetland birds. We are very appreciated the donations.
